What is Bala Vihar?

Bala means child, **Vihar** means a place of love and joy. Balavihar is a place where children can learn about Hindu Cultural and Spiritual traditions in an environment that is filled with love and joy. We also offer Indian language and Vedic chanting classes.

When children become youths, they graduate to the Yuva Kendra, which literally means "Youth Center."

Every year, the Balavihar children in each class are given an opportunity to express what they have learned in class using skits and presentation. This allows them to showcase how they intend to apply that knowledge in their life to a wider audience.

We offer day camps during school holidays, with fun, thoughtprovoking themes and subjects and conduct Bhagavad Gita chanting competition for the children every year.

Good conduct, Emotional refinement, Intellectual finesse and Spiritual awareness are developed by mature Sevaks through fun and play, and through stories, Bhajans and discussions. The children are encouraged to be responsible, alert and sensitive members of society.

Gurudev believed that just as the strength of a wall depends on the quality of each brick, so too, the health of a society depended on the individuals. If the individuals are healthy, the society is healthy.
